Deaths per 1,000 births

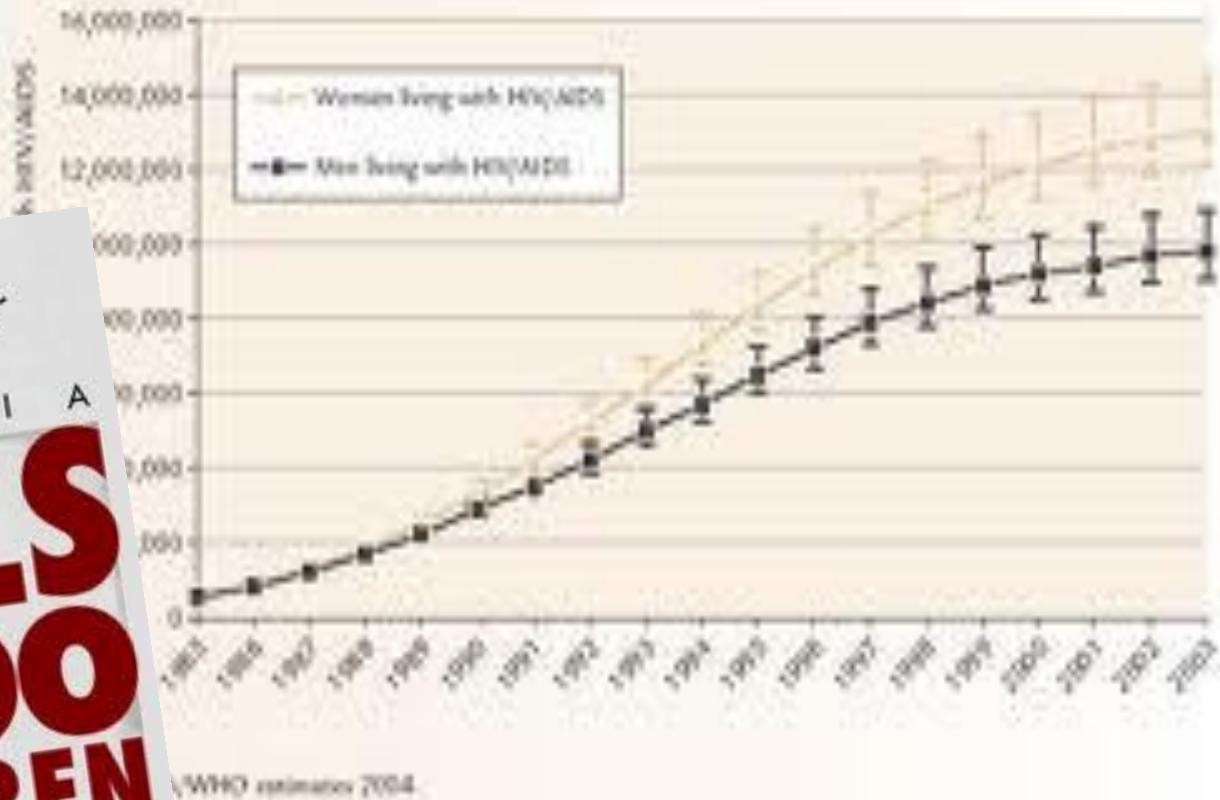

Estimated number of adult (15-49) women and men living with HIV/AIDS in sub-Saharan Africa over time (1985-2003)

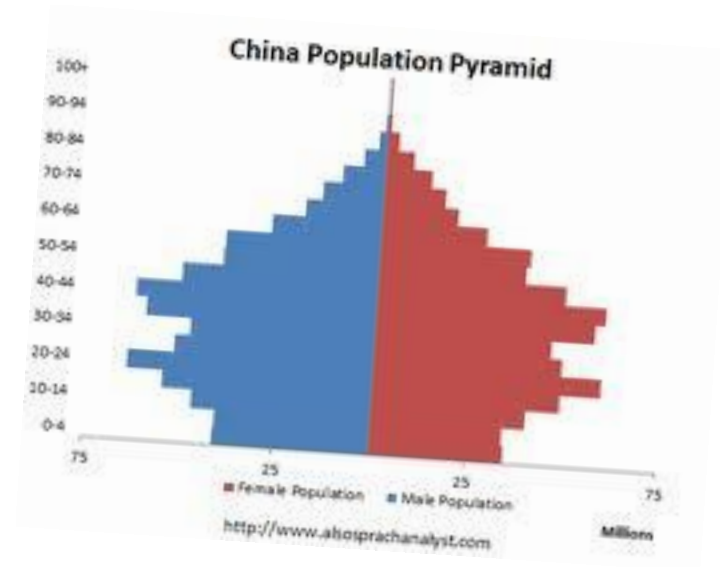
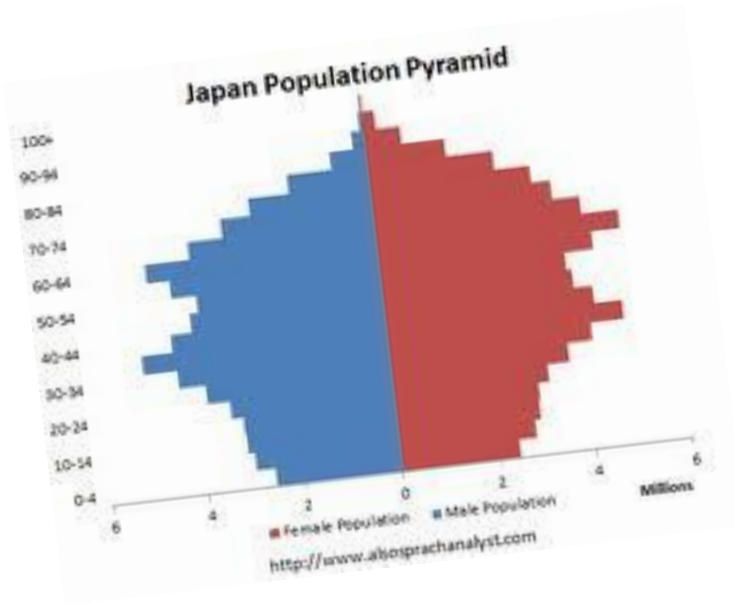
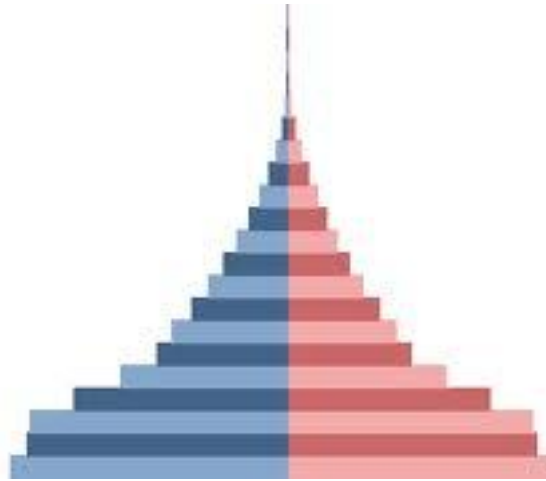
